Looking back ...

By the way, did you know that football is an old game invented by the Chinese more than 2000



years ago? They called it TSU CHU which literally means "kick the ball" and bamboo poles were used as goals.

Also the ancient Greeks played a similar ball game.

The starting point of modern football came with the expansion of public schools in England in the middle of the 19th century. At Eton, Harrow or Winchester



organized games became part of curriculum with emphasis on order, discipline and team spirit. So it all began there but then quickly spread to Europe and other continents. However, at first only boys or men could take part in official events, till in 1991 the first FIFA World Cup for women was held in China. And so football has become the most popular sport for both genders worldwide played by nearly 250 million people including 40 million women. The number of TV viewers, stadium spectators and fans amounts to billions.

Maybe a new record will be set up during the 2006 world championship.

Who says girls cannot play traditional male sports? After women proved themselves capable of running marathons, sailing around the world single-handedly and swimming the Channel, in the late 20th century, their approach to football was just a question of time.



Girls' football is the fastest-growing sport in Britain, and now some of the most famous schools in the country are practising dribbling, passing and shooting, sometimes under professional instruction.

A competition organizer and coach, said that one reason football was attractive to girls was that there was such fluidity in the game, whereas netball players must occupy set positions.



Lynn Wright, a PE teacher, pointed out, "I think girls like football today because it's more physical than some of the other sports they do. It may be because the girls today are a bit more rufty-tufty*, if you get my meaning." Her students added the "team spirit" as well.
